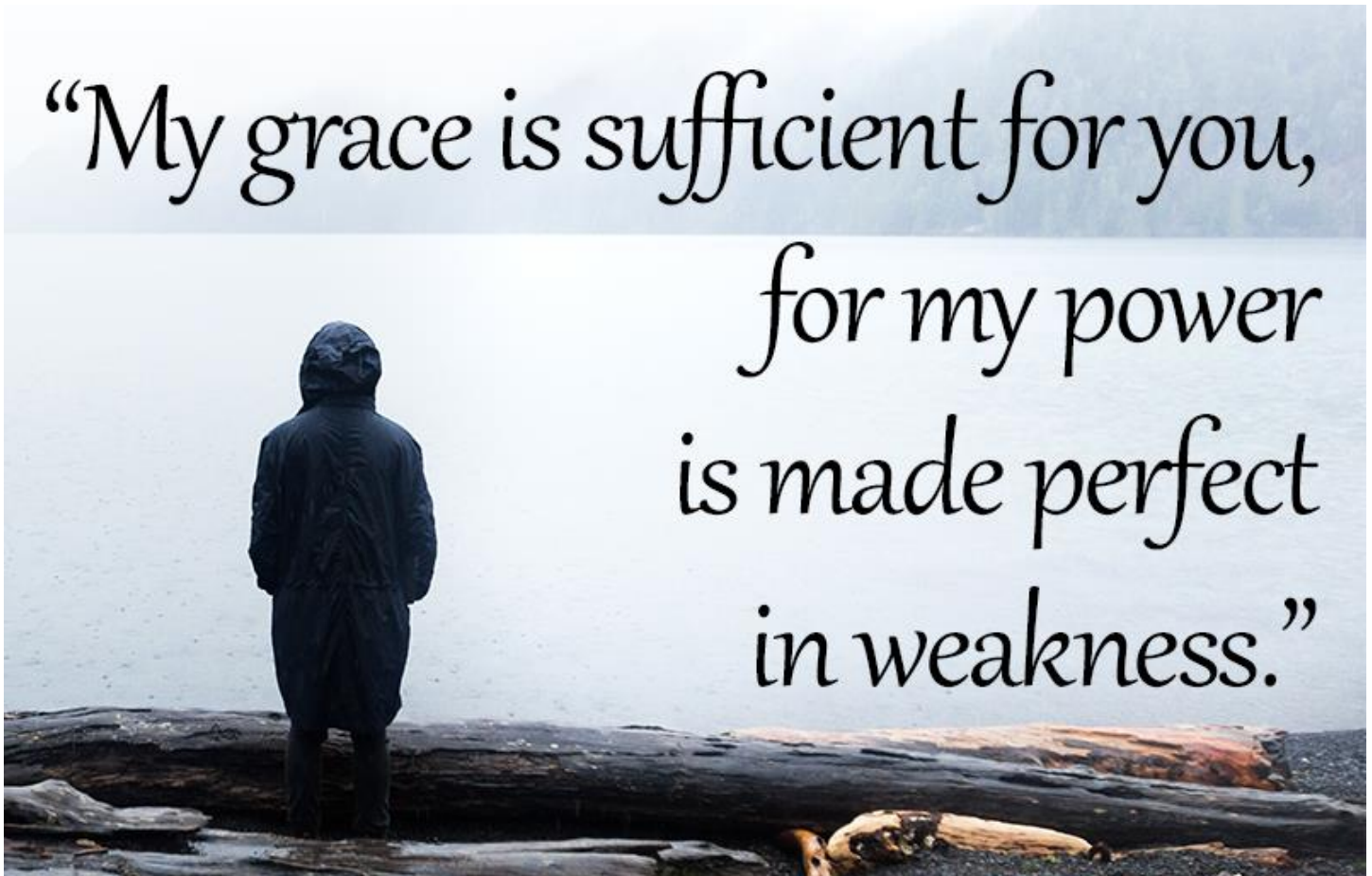


Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

For when I am weak, then I am strong.
